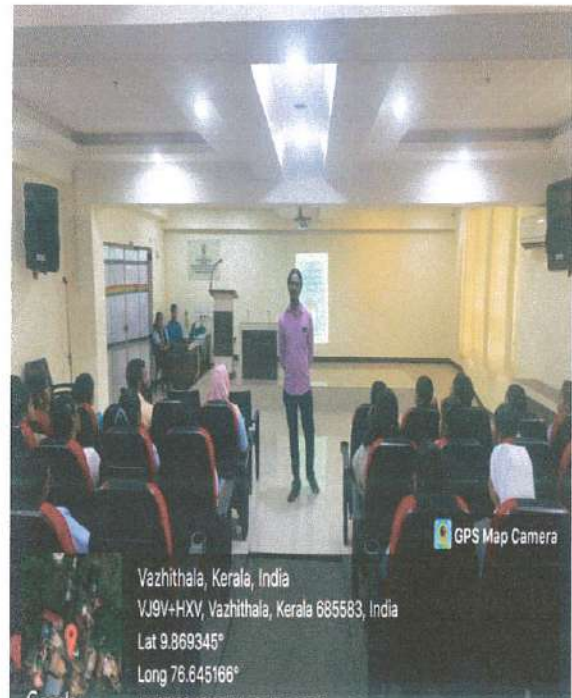

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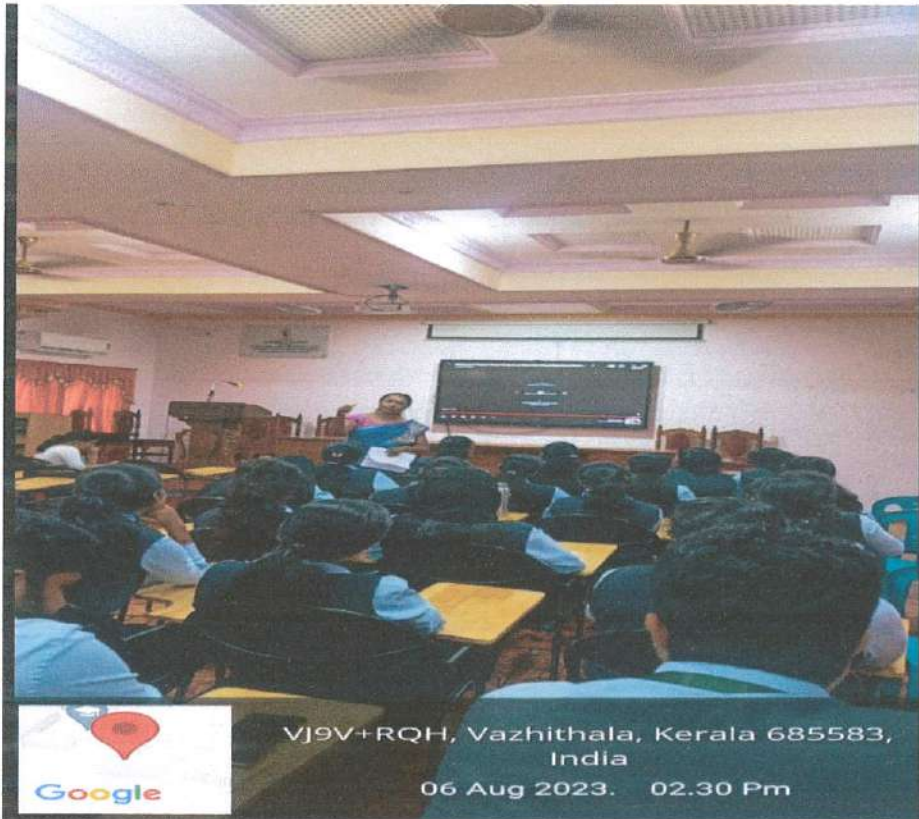


Exam Regulations: Code of Conduct of Examination

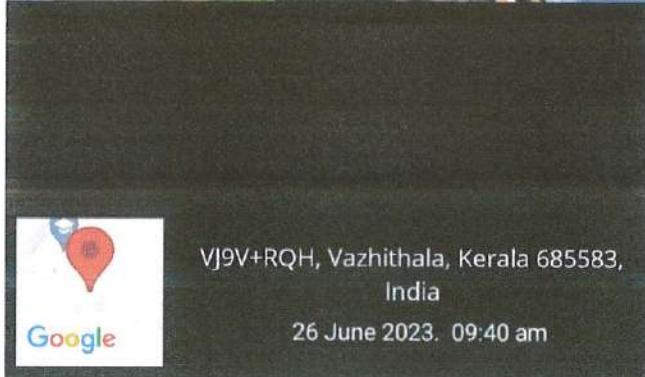

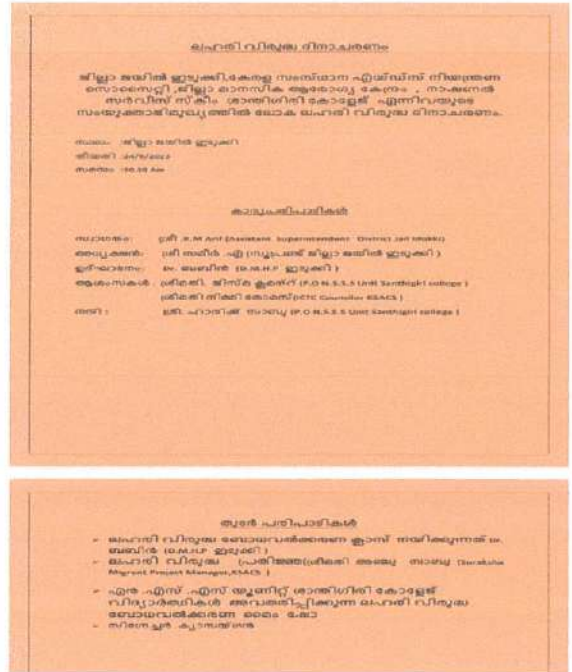

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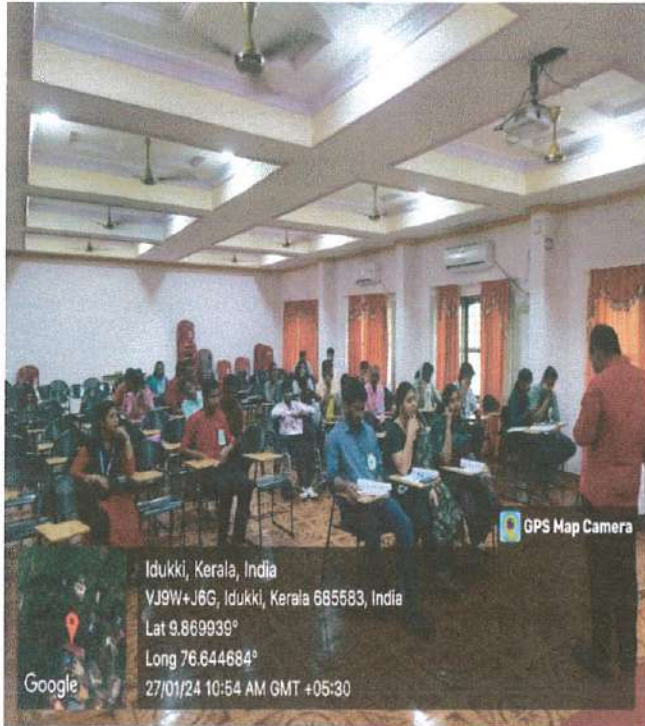


World Disability Day

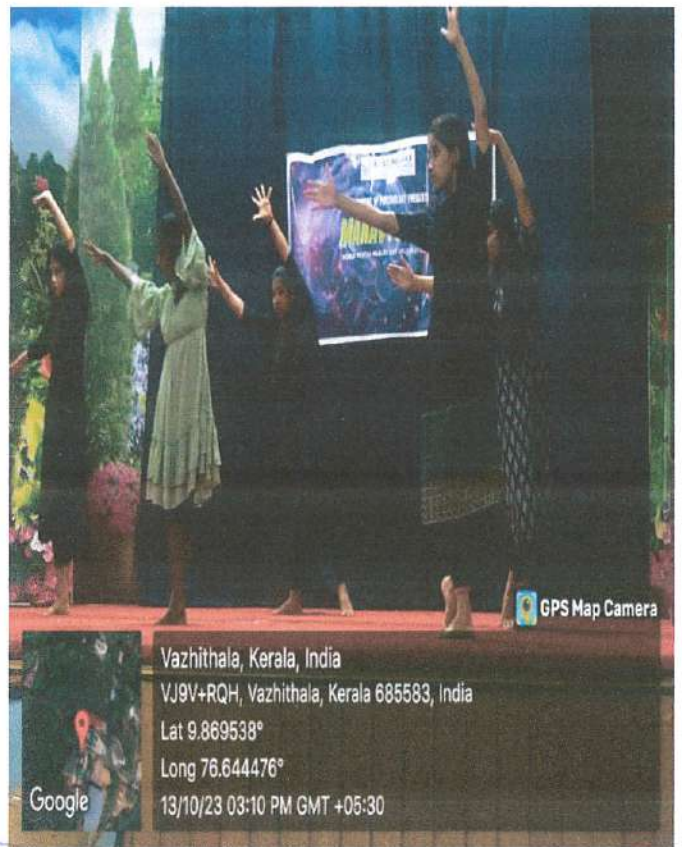


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World Mental Health Day
